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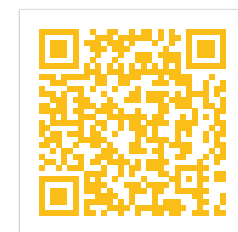
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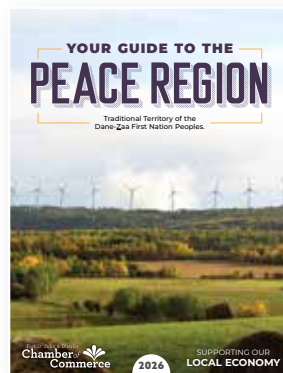

WELCOME TO THE PEACE RIVER REGIONAL DISTRICT

The Peace River Regional District (PRRD) was established in 1967, and is geographically the largest regional district in BC, encompassing over 119,000 kilometres.

A regional district provides regional and sub-regional services to in accordance with the Local Government Act and Community Charter, governed by a Regional Board of Directors who are elected from each electoral area, and elected council of each municipality.

The PRRD serves seven incorporated communities and four electoral areas that include 46 unincorporated (rural) communities. There are eight First Nations communities within the Regional District's boundaries, including the traditional lands of the McLeod Lake Indian Band.

Explore the breathtaking prehistoric landscapes of Tumbler Ridge, home to one of only five UNESCO Global Geoparks in Canada. Or explore the Peace River Valley in Hudson's Hope, where you can find inspiring landscapes and centuries of our natural history.

Natural Beauty:

Immerse yourself in a background of rolling hills, expansive forests and the mighty Peace River. Wander the shores of our great northern lakes and find the fish where they swim. Hike, ride, boat, fly, and explore!

WELCOME TO THE PEACE, Where opportunity lives.

If you have ever driven north on Highway 97 and watched the landscape open into wide skies, working farms, wind turbines, and rivers that look like they were designed for postcards, you already know the Peace River Region is not just a place on a map.

It is a place where things get built, careers get launched, businesses get started, and families put down roots.

Yes, we have trucks. Yes, we have steel-toed boots. We also have live music, outdoor concerts, galleries, youth sports leagues, and some of the best fishing you will ever pretend you are good at.

A common statement in our region is, ***“Well, we came here 27 years ago on a one-year plan to earn some money... we just can’t beat the life here.”***

SMALL POPULATION, BIG OUTPUT

The Peace River Region plays a central role in the provincial economy, generating most of B.C.’s natural gas, a significant portion of its electricity, and the majority of its agricultural grain output.

This concentration of production makes the region one of the most economically productive areas per capita in the province.



Fort St. John is one of the sunniest places in British Columbia, with about 2,095 hours of sunshine a year and roughly 304 days with some sun.

For comparison, Vancouver averages about 1,938 hours of sunshine annually.

ECONOMIC ENGINE OF THE PROVINCE

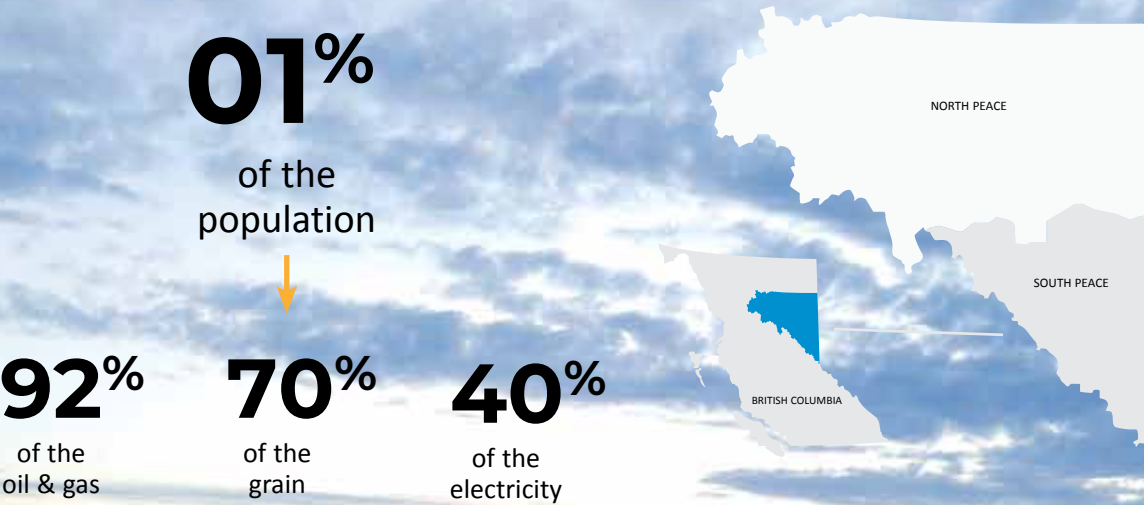
Northeast BC (NEBC) spans approximately 200,000km², making up about 22% of the province's total land area. For context, NEBC is big enough to fit Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward Island combined, with room to spare. The region lies east of the Rocky Mountains and is characterized by boreal forests, grasslands, foothills, and river valleys. The Peace River, which flows eastward into Alberta, is the defining waterway of the region.

The Peace River Region is an economic engine for the province, contributing substantially to British Columbia's prosperity while representing just over 1% of it's population.

Dominated by resource industries (natural gas, hydroelectric power, forestry, mining, and agriculture), the region generates significant GDP, exports, and employment.

Supplying nearly all of British Columbia's natural gas (about one third of Canada's total) and more than 30 percent of its hydroelectric power, Northeast BC is the foundation of the province's energy security.

While small in population (~70,000 residents), Northeast BC punches far above its weight by powering homes, fuelling industries, and anchoring the provincial economy in ways that ripple far beyond its borders. The region's continued prosperity is essential to the well-being of communities across all of British Columbia.

The Peace has a young, working-age population and a high labour force participation rate compared to many parts of B.C.

About 68 per cent of residents in the Northeast region are of working age.

Most people commute less than 15 minutes to work, and the vast majority drive, reflecting local job locations and short travel times.

Regionally, unemployment in Northeast B.C. has typically remained at or below the provincial average, sitting around 6 per cent in recent data.

In plain terms: this is a place where people work, where jobs span multiple sectors, and where getting to work does not take half your day.

The Peace Region is located on the traditional territory of the Dane-zaa First Nation peoples.

According to Dane-zaa oral history, the Peace River is named for the settling of a conflict between the Dane-zaa and the Cree. The Cree traditionally lived south and east of the Upper Peace River region. Due to their trade with settlers, they had guns and they pushed the Dane-zaa northwest in the late 18th century. A peace treaty, negotiated in the late 1700s or early 1800s, stated that the Cree would live south of the Peace River, and the Dane-zaa north. The Peace River, before and after its new name, marked a boundary zone, where groups met for trade, celebration, and settling of disputes.

Archaeological evidence at Charlie Lake Cave establishes that the area of Charlie Lake north of Fort St. John has been continuously occupied for 12,500 years by varying cultures of indigenous peoples.

The Dane-zaa of Fort St. John took an adhesion to Treaty 8 in 1900. Today they continue to have a strong cultural and economic presence in the North Peace area.

The Peace Region is home to several First Nation communities, including:

- Blueberry River First Nation
- Prophet River First Nation
- Doig River First Nation
- Halfway River First Nation
- Fort Nelson First Nation
- Saulteau First Nation
- West Moberly First Nations
- Tsay Keh Dene Band

The ethno-linguistic grouping within these First Nations communities includes Sicannie (Sikanni), Slavey, Beaver (Dane-zaa), Cree, Saulteau and Dene.

On June 21, 1899, the eighth treaty between the Indigenous people of North America and the Queen of England was signed and would become known as the most comprehensive treaty in Canada.

The signatories of Treaty No. 8 agreed to the oral promises made during these negotiations and understood them as a partnership based on peace and friendship, a partnership that would create certainty for both parties, *“For as long as the sun shines, the grass grows and the rivers flow”*.

The Treaty 8 Tribal Association was incorporated in 1982 under the BC Societies Act and currently represents six of the First Nations in Northeastern BC. The Treaty 8 Tribal Association acts as a coordinator, facilitator, and technical support on various issues as mandated from time to time by the Council of Treaty 8 Chiefs.

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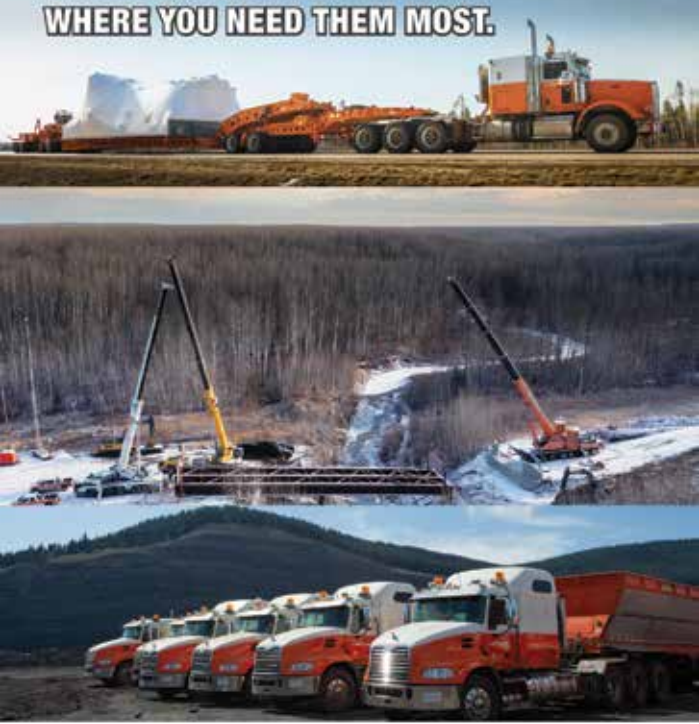
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THE NORTH PEACE

THE ENERGETIC CITY

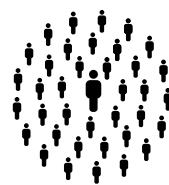
The City of Fort St. John has become the economic and employment hub of Northeast British Columbia, emerging over the past 15 years as the primary service centre for the broader Peace Region. As the largest city in the region, Fort St. John functions as the commercial, administrative, and industrial base that supports surrounding communities, rural areas, and resource developments.

The city's economy is strongly tied to energy production, particularly oil and natural gas development throughout the Montney formation and surrounding basins. Many major energy companies maintain regional offices in Fort St. John, alongside engineering firms, service contractors, and supply companies that support exploration, drilling, and production across Northern British Columbia and neighbouring Alberta. This concentration of industry has helped drive employment growth, population stability, and continued investment in commercial and residential development.

Transportation infrastructure also reinforces Fort St. John's role as a regional hub. The nearby North Peace Regional Airport provides regular commercial flights that connect the city to

major centres across Western Canada, enabling efficient travel for industry professionals and supporting regional business activity.

Together with its growing retail sector, professional services, and expanding residential neighbourhoods, Fort St. John continues to serve as the central economic engine for the North Peace region and a key gateway to resource development in northern British Columbia.

MEET A FORT ST. JOHN ENTREPRENEUR BUSINESS PROFILE

The Crooked Spoon Meal Co. was built on a simple belief — that food should fuel your body, support your health, and still taste incredible.

Owner Bonnie Gouldie created The Crooked Spoon from a deeply personal journey with nutrition and healing. Growing up connected to the land — hunting, fishing, and gardening — she learned early on the value of real, whole foods. Later in life, that understanding became even more important as she began to explore how nutrition could truly impact overall health, energy, and well-being.

Bonnie also understands firsthand the reality of busy, overwhelming seasons of life.

"I know what it's like to work long hours, feel isolated, and not always have access to healthy meals — or any meals at all. I was a single mom working multiple jobs, and getting home to cook something healthy wasn't always easy. I made it work, but there were definitely days I wished there was a fast, healthy option I could rely on."

That experience became part of the foundation for The Crooked Spoon.

What started as meal prep has grown into a space where the community can walk in and find food that is not only convenient, but intentional.

At The Crooked Spoon Meal Co., the focus goes beyond just macros. It's about gut health, quality ingredients, and transparency. Meals are made without shortcuts — no unnecessary additives, no heavy sodium,

and no hidden ingredients. Proteins are not brined or soaked, and everything is prepared with a focus on how it will make you feel, not just how it looks on paper.

The menu is designed to support real life:
- High-protein meals for strength and energy
- Gut-friendly options to support digestion and overall health
- Fresh grab-and-go meals, breakfast options, and protein treats
- Coffee and quick options for busy mornings
- Catered lunches for local businesses and teams.

Bonnie's vision is to make healthy food more accessible — without sacrificing flavor or enjoyment. More than anything, The Crooked Spoon is about community.

It's a place built to support people in their day-to-day lives — whether that's helping someone stay on track with their goals, offering better options for busy families, or simply providing a welcoming space to grab something nourishing.

Residents and visitors enjoy access to hiking, paddling, and outdoor exploration, as well as nearby attractions such as the Tumbler Ridge UNESCO Global Geopark and the Tse'k'wa National Historic Site. These places allow many people who come north to find meaning, connection, and a sense of home.

Fort St. John is also a regional leader in sport and recreation. Facilities such as the Pomeroy Sport Centre support athletes, families, and community groups, while continued investment in parks, public spaces, and amenities ensures opportunities for all ages and abilities. One of the most significant initiatives now before the community is the proposed new aquatics facility. Designed to meet long-term needs, the project reflects feedback from residents and user groups and aims to provide a modern, accessible space for recreation, sport, therapy, and community connection.

The City continues to focus on strengthening infrastructure, enhancing public spaces, and supporting a vibrant local economy. Downtown improvements and gathering places like Festival Plaza have become hubs for events, markets, and celebrations, reinforcing Fort St. John as a place where people come together and feel they belong.

The state of the market Real Estate in Fort St. John

“When you live in Fort St. John, you’ll hear the story a hundred times. People come here with a five-year plan...”

First, they rent.

Then maybe they meet someone special – then, as smart, forward-thinking folks, they decide to buy and put down some roots. You know... stop paying someone else’s mortgage.

Maybe ‘littles’ follow and suddenly it’s time for a bit more room... and another five years quietly gets added to the plan.

Before you know it, the ‘littles’ are bigger. They have friends, sports teams, and favourite teachers. You know every one of your neighbours.

Now it’s been ten years – and no one is leaving.

That pattern isn’t accidental. It’s supported by something Fort St. John still has, that much of the province does not: housing affordability.

Fort St. John’s Housing Affordability Indicator sits at 24.4%, meaning the major costs of home-ownership represent roughly a quarter of the median household income.

Put another way, in many parts of the province housing costs stretch households to their limit. **In Fort St. John, home-ownership does not have to mean major sacrifices.**

Combine that with comparatively attainable housing prices and the result is something increasingly rare in Canada today: a place where career growth and home-ownership can happen at the same time.

Affordability makes home-ownership possible – but home-ownership builds something harder to measure: community.

That distinction has been consistent. Independent rankings have repeatedly placed Fort St. John among the most affordable cities in British Columbia, often landing near the top of the list.

As of February 2026, the average **sale price of homes is up 8% year-over-year and roughly 6% over the past three years**. The trend is expected to continue through 2026 – and likely at a steeper pace.

Why? What’s the catalyst?

More people are arriving to work in the region’s industries, public services, and supporting businesses – and they all need somewhere to live.

Active listings are down 18% year-over-year, and 30% lower than they were three years ago, and continuing to trend down.

Simply put: there aren’t enough homes. In 2025, there were only 10 building permits issued for residential construction in Fort St. John.

Across the province, builders are facing ever-increasing construction costs. But the challenge in Fort St. John is slightly different: housing prices are still low enough that there is often a razor-thin line between making a modest profit and taking a loss.

Historically, a building project in Fort St. John might have started when market conditions looked promising, but by the time finishing touches are being completed, material costs may have risen and the market softened slightly – that’s not what we’re seeing today. New builds are being sold at top dollar (for Fort St. John) and often sell right as soon as they’re put on the market.

It has become enough of an issue that the City of Fort St. John is actively exploring ways to attract builders from the Lower Mainland, where new construction has slowed in recent years.

The rental market is feeling it too.

Rental listings in Fort St. John can receive dozens of applications on the first day they appear online. Rental prices are rising as well, with similar units renting for 10–20% more than they were just a year ago.

For newcomers arriving in the city, finding a place to rent is often the first challenge they encounter.

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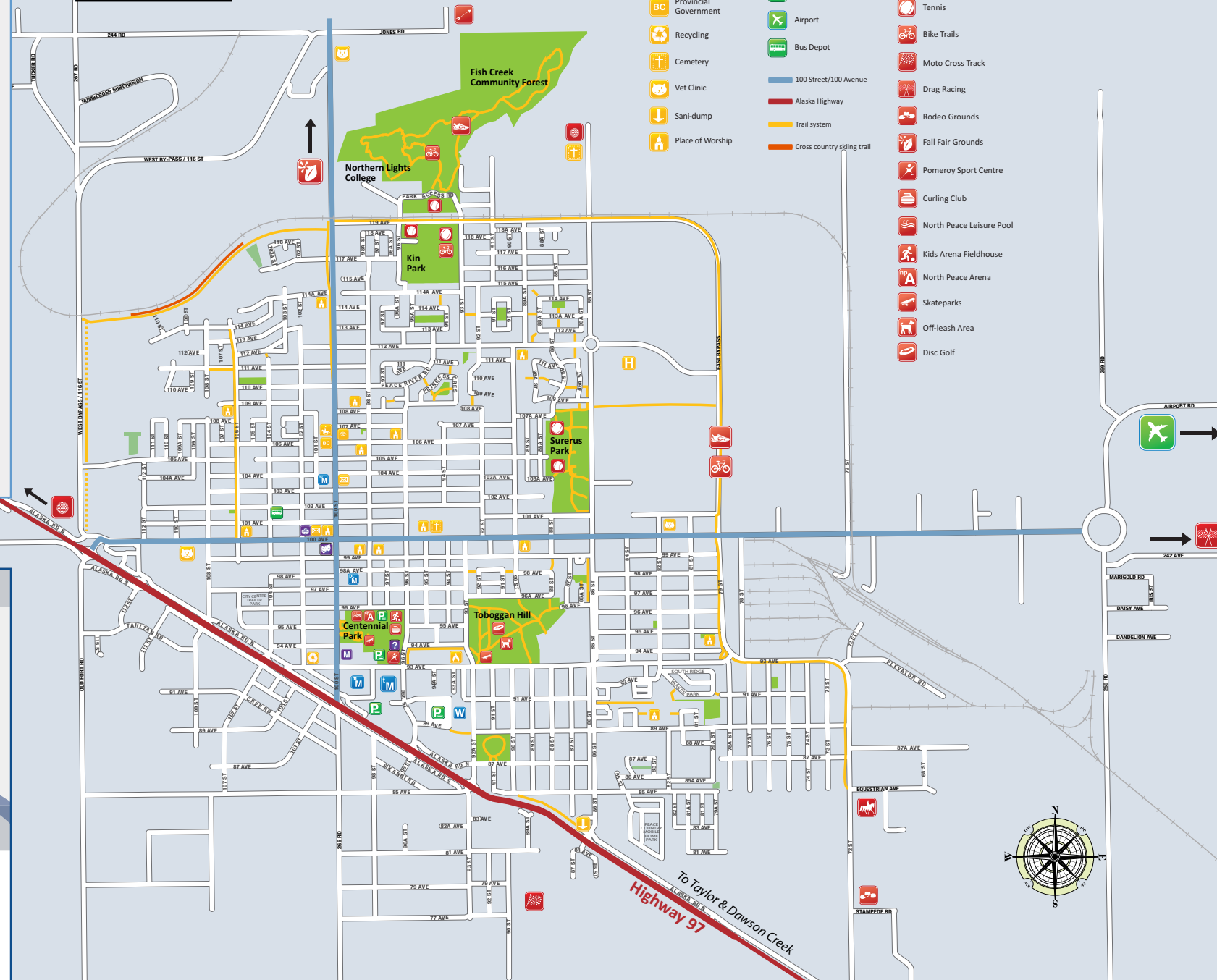

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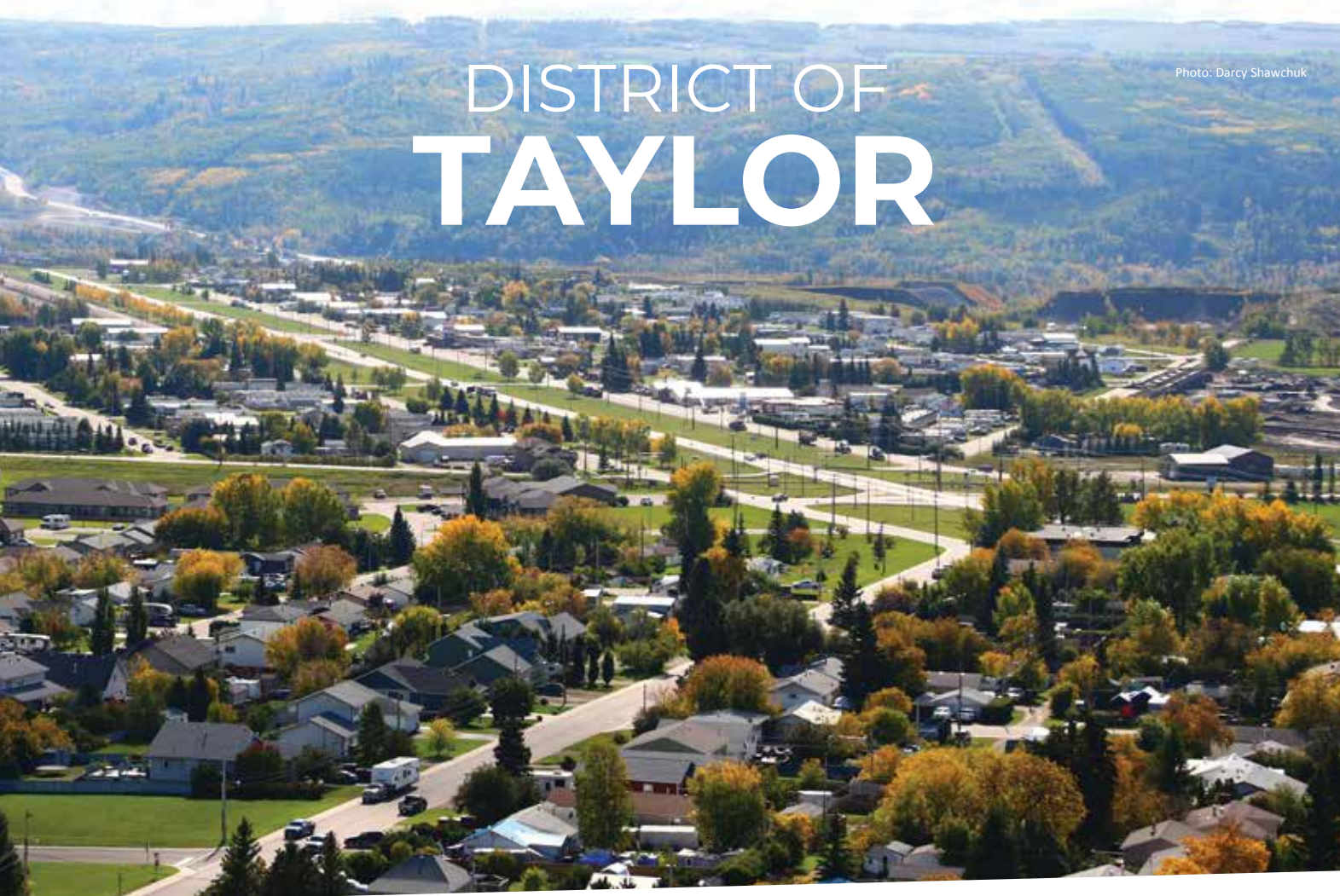

Located just north of Fort St. John along the historic Alaska Highway, the community of Charlie Lake offers residents and visitors a unique blend of lakeside living and accessible outdoor recreation.

The area is known for its strong connection to the lake itself, with a popular public boat launch providing easy access for boating, fishing, and summer recreation on Charlie Lake.

The community is home to important history: the Alaska Highway Memorial, a significant historical landmark commemorating the construction of the Alaska Highway during the Second World War, and the Tse'k'wa National Historical

Site, an important Dane-zaa cultural site dating back more than 12,500 years.

Tse'k'wa ("rock house" in Dane-zaa/Beaver language) is an important cultural site for the Dane-zaa people, dating back more than 12,500 years. Formerly known as the Charlie Lake Cave, it is now recognized as a National Historic Site for its cultural and archaeological significance. The site is owned and managed by the Tse'k'wa Heritage Society, a non-profit organization that is a collaboration of three First Nations: Doig River, Prophet River and West Moberly First Nations. Their shared vision is to share Dane-zaa culture, language, and heritage.

The Society continues to transform the site to welcome the public. Improvements include an interpretive trail to the cave, open air amphitheater, accessible picnic tables and outhouses, and an archaeology dome. Indoor interpretive experiences are planned for the future. The Society's goal is to create a world-class museum and interpretive centre connecting the past, present, and future.

Tse'k'wa Heritage Society invites you to enter a gathering space used by the Dane-zaa since the time of the wǒlii nachíí (giant animals). Our cultural programming and public events will bring you on an exciting journey of shared history that builds respect for our land's First Peoples. 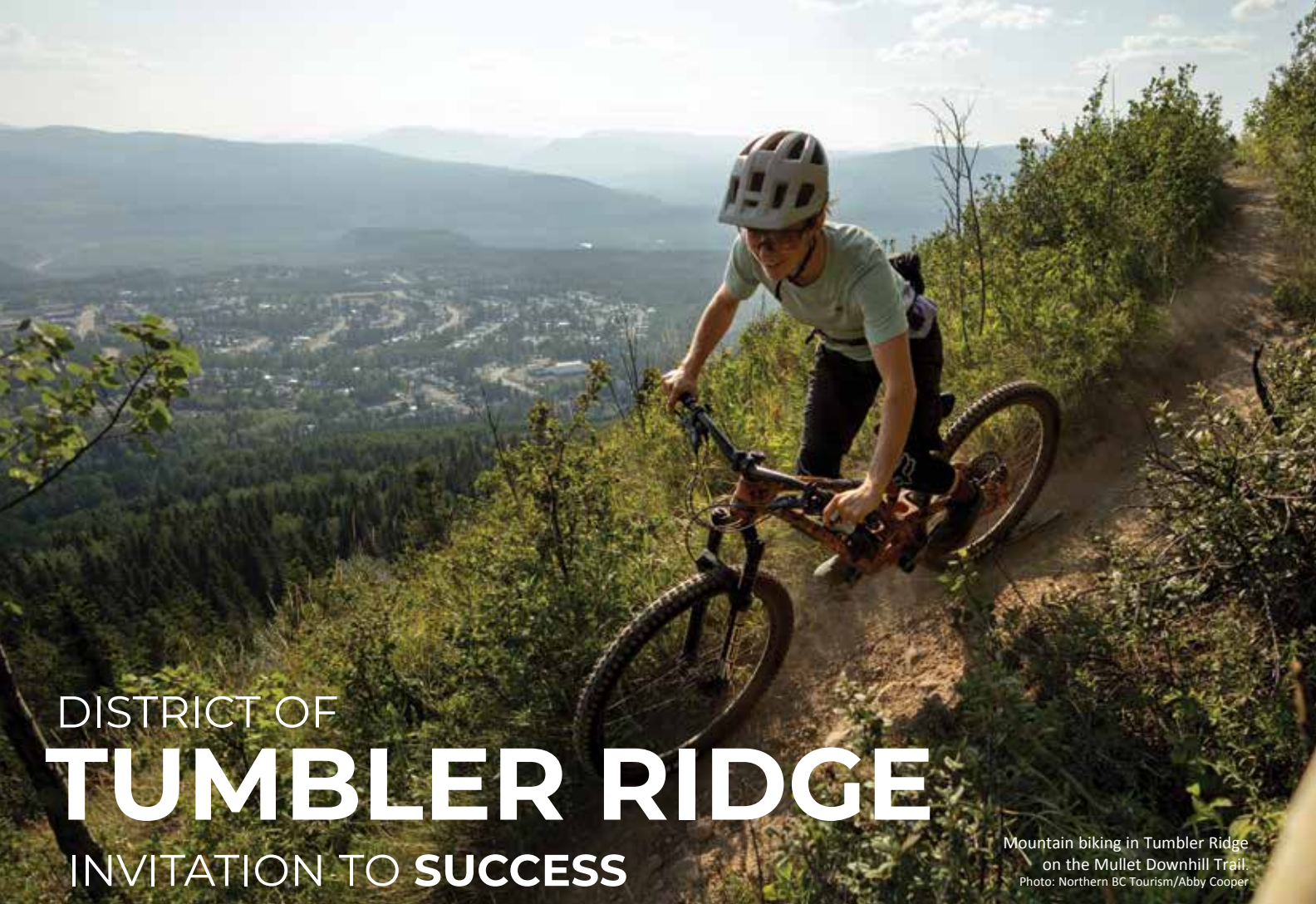

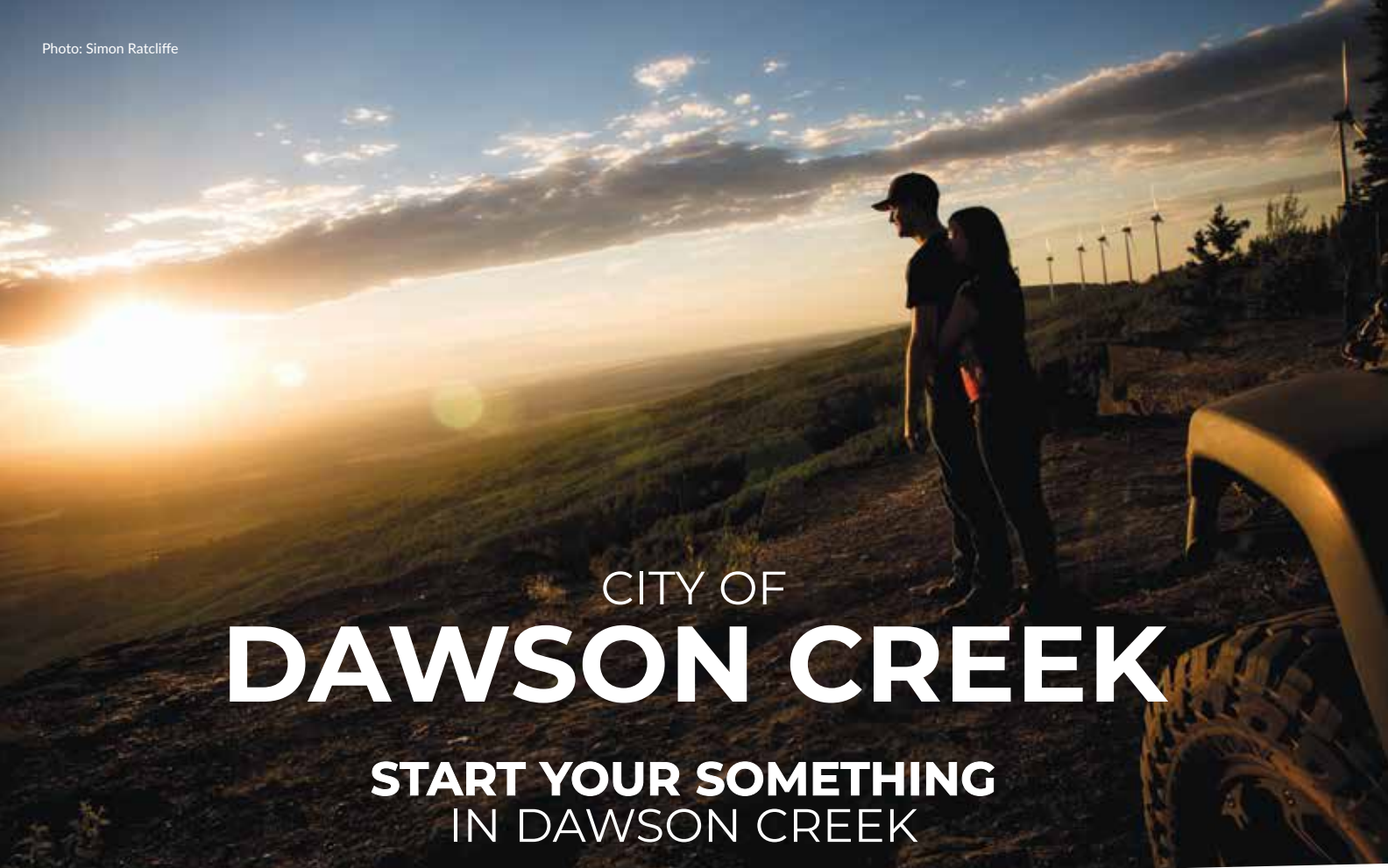

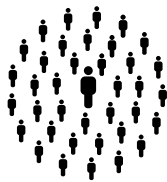

Within the community, Dawson Creek continues to invest in quality of life and long-term infrastructure. The Ovintiv Events Centre acts as a major gathering place for sports, concerts, and regional events, drawing visitors from across the region and Northern Alberta. At the same time, ongoing revitalization efforts in the downtown core are helping strengthen the local business environment by encouraging new investment, improving public spaces, and supporting small businesses.

Municipal leadership has also prioritized long-term infrastructure development, including significant investments in water system upgrades that support future residential, commercial, and industrial growth. Combined with relatively affordable housing compared to many other Canadian communities, Dawson Creek continues to attract families, professionals, and entrepreneurs looking for opportunity in a vibrant northern economy.

Together, strong transportation connections, a thriving agricultural base, expanding energy development, and strategic community investment position Dawson Creek as a key economic centre in the South Peace region.

OIL & GAS

The Peace Region is home to the Montney Formation - one of the largest known oil and gas resources in the world.

The Peace Region has long been recognized as one of Canada’s most productive energy hubs. Oil and gas development serves as a cornerstone of our region’s economy, supporting thousands of jobs, generating significant investment, and fueling economic activity throughout our area.

Over the past two decades, our region has evolved into a globally significant centre for natural gas production, driven largely by the development of the Montney Formation.

The Montney Formation, which stretches across Northeastern British Columbia and into Alberta, is widely regarded as one of the most important unconventional natural gas and liquids plays in the world. Its vast reserves and consistent productivity have attracted major energy companies and billions of dollars in investment. Producers operating in the Peace Region supply both domestic markets and an expanding network of international export infrastructure, positioning the Montney as a key component of Canada’s role in the global energy landscape.

Technological innovation has played a critical role in unlocking the Montney’s potential. Advances in horizontal drilling, multi-stage hydraulic fracturing, and real-time data monitoring have dramatically improved efficiency and recovery rates. Modern drilling techniques allow companies to extract more energy from each well while reducing the number of surface sites required. These efficiencies have helped maintain the region’s competitiveness even as global energy markets fluctuate.

Several major energy companies maintain a strong presence in the Peace Region, including industry leaders such as ARC Resources, Tourmaline Oil, Ovintiv, Shell Canada, and ConocoPhillips. These companies operate extensive drilling programs and maintain offices, field facilities, and supply chains throughout the region. Their operations support a broad network of service companies, contractors, and local businesses that together form the backbone of the region’s industrial economy.

Natural gas produced in the Peace Region feeds into a growing network of pipelines that connect Northeastern BC to both domestic and international markets. One of the most significant pieces of infrastructure is the Coastal GasLink pipeline, a 670 km project that transports natural gas from the Montney region to the LNG Canada export facility in Kitimat. Once fully operational, the pipeline will have the capacity to transport approximately 2.1 billion cubic feet of natural gas per day, supplying liquefied natural gas to global markets.

Other export infrastructure is also strengthening the Peace Region’s role in international energy trade. The AltaGas Ridley Island Propane Export Terminal near Prince Rupert receives propane produced in the Montney and ships it to overseas markets, particularly in Asia. This facility provides another outlet for natural gas liquids produced in Northeastern BC, adding value to the region’s resource development.

Looking to the future, the proposed Prince Rupert Gas Transmission pipeline represents another potential milestone for our region. Designed to move natural gas from the Peace Region to the West Coast for LNG export, the project could further expand our connection to global energy markets. Once complete, it will build upon the momentum created by Coastal GasLink and reinforce our position as one of North America’s most important natural gas producers.

Together, these developments illustrate the continuing importance of oil and gas in the Peace Region. With world-class resources, cutting-edge technology, and expanding export infrastructure, Northeastern British Columbia remains a vital contributor to Canada’s energy economy and a key supplier to the growing global demand for natural gas.

LNG Canada has successfully loaded a first cargo of liquefied natural gas that is now destined for global markets, marking the start of operations at Canada’s first large-scale LNG export facility. This historic achievement is made possible in part due to the oil & gas produced in the Peace Region, and delivered to the west coast via the Coastal GasLink pipeline.

The oil and gas industry is evolving, and so has the training of its workers.

Working in partnership with Tourmaline Oil, Northern Lights College created the **Field Operations Specialist — Hydrocarbon Resources (FOS-HR) program** to ensure the field operators of the future would be well prepared to work in the industry.

“Going out on our practicum helped us see what we were learning in class we could actually use and helped us understand the processes further,”

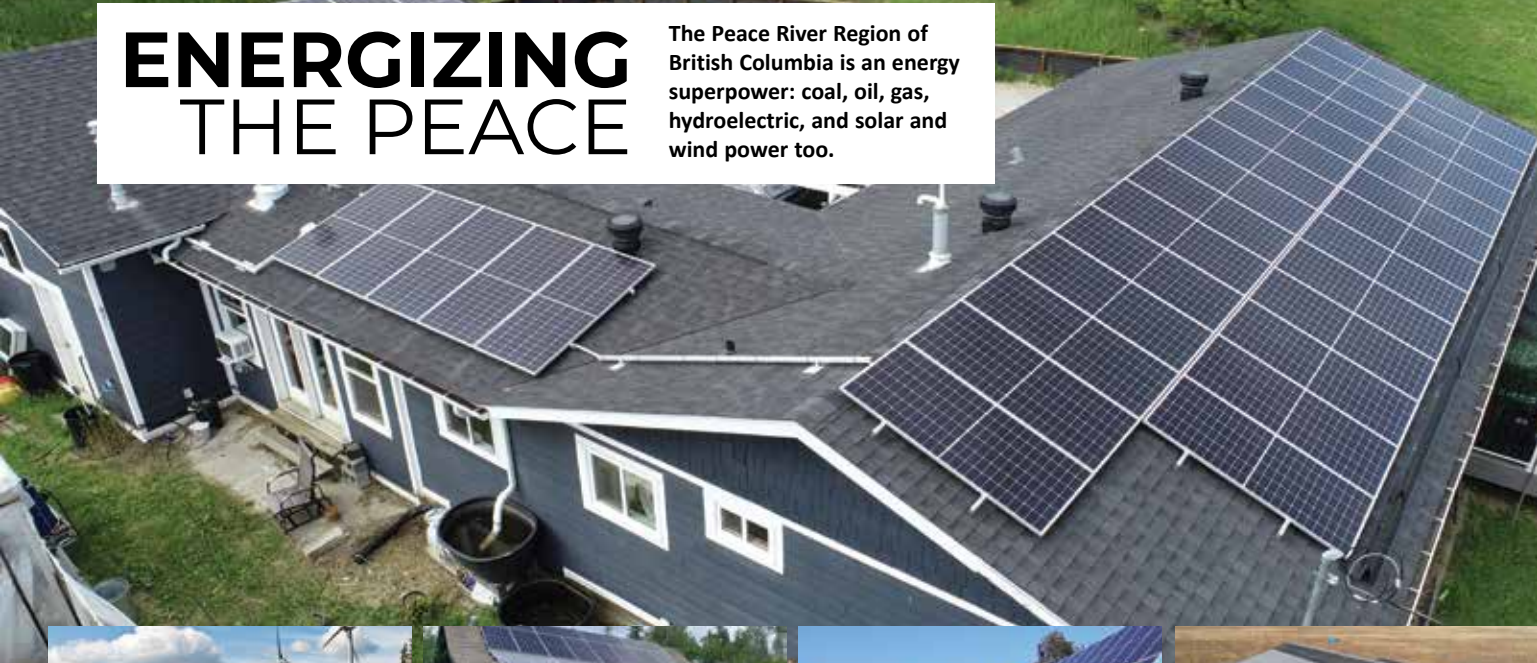
the FOS-HR class wrote in a letter to their instructor, Eleanor Vokes.

ENERGIZING THE PEACE

The Peace River Region of British Columbia is an energy superpower: coal, oil, gas, hydroelectric, and solar and wind power too.



Solar and wind: these are no longer energies of the future, they are the energies of now, and for good reason. They have quickly become the least expensive energies ever, and the Peace River Region is rich in both.

A remarkable organization, Peace Energy Co-op, based in Dawson Creek, is spearheading renewable energy adoption in the Peace Region. They were the first renewable energy cooperative in western Canada, and the second in Canada overall.

Early in their formation in 2003 they were the lead organization that made British Columbia’s first commercial wind facility a reality: Bear Mountain Wind Park. Situated just a short distance from Dawson Creek, this impressive state of the art wind facility (34, 3-megawatt wind turbines) is also a popular recreational area and tourist attraction. A map to guide visitors there is available from the Peace Energy Co-op office and Tourism Dawson Creek.

The sunny Peace Region is also a great place to add solar to your home or business. Peace Energy Co-op has custom designed and installed more than one million watts of solar in the region.

“We don’t just sell solar equipment,” explains Peace Energy Co-op’s solar consultant Greg Dueck, “we custom design a solar power system that fits the needs of your home, farm, ranch or business, then we supply the equipment and install it with our team of experienced solar installers.”

With careful design and our rich solar resource, it’s easy to eliminate a home or business’s electrical bills completely. Peace Energy Co-op is quick to point out that there are generous BC Hydro rebates available for home and business solar, so now is a good time reap the financial and security benefits of having your own solar power system.

Solar makes sense at any scale, to power a home or a whole town or city. The town of Hudson’s Hope, just an hour and a half drive west of Dawson Creek, is home to the province’s largest municipal solar project. Peace Energy Co-op designed and installed a total of just over 500 kilowatts of solar on nine of their municipal buildings, a project that now saves the District of Hudson’s Hope about \$70,000 a year in electrical expenses, and will continue to do so for at least 25 years. Quite an accomplishment for a small northern town of just 1,100 residents!

The almost 700 members of Peace Energy Cooperative share a common vision: a future filled with hope and opportunity powered by the limitless, renewable energies of the sun and wind. Working together in the Peace Region they are making this vision a reality, one solar panel at a time.

HARNESSING THE NORTHERN WINDS

WIND POWER

Four large wind facilities are in full operation across the North Peace region, producing an estimated total of 570+ MW.

The **Bear Mountain Wind Park** is an electricity generating wind farm facility located near Dawson Creek. It is owned by Bear Mountain Wind LP and began operations in November, 2009. BC’s first operating wind farm has a generating capacity of **102 MW**.

Meikle Wind near Tumbler Ridge is a **180 MW** wind energy generation project with 61 GE wind turbines. The project has the annual energy capacity equal to the needs of approximately 54,000 British Columbian homes.

The **Dokie Ridge Wind Farm** is a wind farm located near Chetwynd. It was put into commercial operation in 2011. The facility has a generating capacity of **144 MW** and is producing 320 to 340 gigawatt-hours of energy per year.

Capital Power’s **142 MW Quality Wind** facility located near Tumbler Ridge, began commercial operation on November 6,

2012, on time and under budget. The project generates enough clean electricity to meet the average annual needs of about 43,000 homes.

These are all Independent power producer projects, feeding clean wind power into the BC grid under contract with BC Hydro. The future of the wind industry in the Peace is bright, with over 10,000 MW of wind energy potential waiting for development.

Two new Wind Power projects were announced in 2025:

The **Stewart Creek Wind Project** is a partnership between West Moberly First Nations and Innergex. The project is expected to come online in 2030 and produce an additional 200 MW.

The **Taylor Wind Project** is a partnership between Saulteau First Nations and EDF Renewables. The project is expected to come online in 2031 and produce an estimated 200 MW.

AGRICULTURE

The Peace Region is classified as a prairie and Canada’s most northern agricultural region.

Long before any oil exploration took place, the North Peace was largely populated by farmers. In fact, Fort St. John’s downtown was once part of a farm owned by Clark Mackenzie Finch, whose name adorns one of the elementary schools in the city.

The Peace Region lays claim to almost **11.5 million acres** of agricultural land - **27% of BC’s total Agricultural Reserve**. An estimated **1,532 farms and ranches** are located throughout our region.

Located on the only prairie in BC, The Peace Region is filled with fertile farmland, which **produces most the province’s grains**, including canola, barley, oats and wheat,

and supports a thriving livestock industry. Farms located along river valleys also produce field crops that grow well in shorter seasons, like root vegetables, peas, cabbage and sweet corn. The livestock grown in the region ranges from beef and dairy cattle, to bison, ostriches, chickens, hogs and sheep.

In addition, an increasing number of smaller farmers produce organically certified meat and produce. Much of this product is sold direct to the public through local Farmer's Markets and the Peace Region Farmer’s Institute. The Butcher Block, located in Fort St. John and Dawson Creek sells locally produced meat including sought-after Hutterite turkeys from the South Peace Colony.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS IN THE NORTHEAST

Northern Health delivers a full spectrum of health care services across the Northeast, supporting residents in Fort St. John and Hudson’s Hope, Dawson Creek, Chetwynd and Tumbler Ridge, and Fort Nelson. This integrated model allows residents of diverse rural and remote communities to access both local services and region-wide specialty care through coordinated pathways.

Acute care services

Acute care services are available through a combination of hospitals and health centres that provide services ranging from emergency treatment, inpatient care, surgical services where available, and diagnostic imaging and laboratory support. These services are tailored to the needs of each community while also connecting residents to the broader system when higher levels of care are required.

Dawson Creek and Fort St. John serve as the region’s largest acute care centres, providing emergency care, inpatient units, maternity and surgical services, medical imaging, pharmacy, laboratory, and ambulatory care services. Dawson Creek is also supported by the construction of the new Dawson Creek & District Hospital, which will introduce expanded emergency and inpatient capacity, modernized maternity and surgical spaces, enhanced medical imaging, and improved patient and family-centred environments to better meet the long-term health care needs of the region.

Communities such as Chetwynd, Hudson’s Hope, and Tumbler Ridge are home to facilities that provide emergency, urgent and primary care services supported by local diagnostic services (lab and medical imaging), with residents accessing higher level emergency or inpatient care through Dawson Creek or Fort St. John.

Across all communities, urgent and emergency care follows a standardized triage process that ensures patients are assessed and treated according to the severity of their condition. Any required patient transfers are coordinated through provincial transport systems, including BC Emergency Health Services, to ensure safe and timely access to the appropriate level of care.

Supporting Indigenous health and cultural safety

Northern Health is committed to providing culturally safe and respectful care for Indigenous patients and families across the region. The Indigenous Health team collaborates with First Nations and Métis communities to provide supports for patients navigating the health system, and works to integrate Indigenous ways of knowing, values, and cultural practices into health services.

Primary and community care

Primary and community care includes the basic health care services that people access through primary care providers like family doctors, nurse practitioners, and other members of the health care team – including access to community specialists and pharmacists.

Northern Health works with community partners to implement a model of care that is centred on the person and their family. This approach involves creating health care teams to provide a range of health care services. This improves and provides continuity of care over time and across settings, resulting in better long-term health outcomes.

Primary Care Networks (PCNs) are partnerships between community partners who work together to ensure patients have access to a full range of team-based primary care services for all their day-to-day health care needs.

Dawson Creek and Fort St. John offer the widest range of primary care providers, supported by community nursing, public health programming, chronic disease management, social work, dietitian services, and rehabilitation.

Chetwynd, Fort Nelson, Hudson’s Hope, and Tumbler Ridge also provide clinic based primary care and community nursing, which includes wound care, health monitoring, chronic disease support, and preventive health services such as immunizations and communicable disease follow-up.

Indigenous Care Teams assist with navigation, communication, advocacy, discharge planning, and ensuring access to cultural and spiritual supports, while Indigenous Patient Experience Advisors work with patients and communities to address concerns and promote culturally respectful care. Northern Health also works in partnership with the First Nations Health Authority, which offers culturally grounded and accessible supports and programs for Indigenous residents across the Northeast.

Home and community care

The Primary and Community Care teams also provide a range of integrated home and community based professional and caregiver services to help people remain independent at home for as long as possible, supporting independence, recovery, and quality of life.

These services also help coordinate and connect people to programs and services as needed, including other health services and community resources. Programs include home support services, adult day programs where available, respite services, palliative services, and access to interprofessional teams (IPT). IPTs deliver community nursing, community nutrition and dietitian services, rehabilitation (occupational and physical therapy) services, social work, and mental health counselling.

Each Northeast community has access to a combination of these services, helping to support smooth transitions between home, hospital, community care, and long-term care when needed.

Long-term Care

Northern Health operates long-term care homes across the region that provide 24 hour professional care and supervision in a protective, supportive environment for people who have complex care needs and can no longer be cared for in their own homes. Care is based on a person and family centred philosophy, supporting physical, emotional, social, and cultural wellbeing.

Fort St. John is home to Peace Villa, which is one of the region’s largest long-term care facilities, while Rotary Manor supports the long-term care needs of Dawson Creek and area residents. In Fort Nelson and Chetwynd, long-term care is provided by the multi-level care unit at the hospital. Residents across the Northeast can access assessment for eligibility and placement in Assisted Living or long-term care, through their local Community Health Services program.

Population and public health

Population and Public Health (PPH) teams deliver immunizations, communicable disease prevention and control, health promotion, harm reduction, school-based health programs, maternal and early childhood supports, wellness education, environmental health inspections, healthy living support, and more. Public health teams also play a major role in promoting the health, safety and well-being of those in licensed care facilities like daycares and long-term care, and in emergency preparedness and responding to health events affecting communities.

Environmental health officers safeguard the well-being of both the public and the environment by overseeing food safety, drinking water systems, recreational water facilities, industrial camps, and other regulated environments, promoting safe and healthy community settings across the region.

Virtual Clinic

Several virtual pathways supplement local services across the region, including the Northern Health Virtual Clinic. The Virtual Clinic is focused on providing timely care for patients who do not currently have a primary care provider. It is supported by a compassionate team of health care professionals including doctors, nurse practitioners, nurses, mental health clinicians, a social worker, and a physiotherapist.

The Northern Health Virtual Primary & Community Care Clinic also provides support for mental health and substance use for residents without a regular provider.

Digital Health Tools

Residents of all Northeast communities benefit from digital health tools offered by Northern Health. HealthElife allows patients to access their hospital records, lab results, and imaging reports online; myhealthkey supports communication with primary care providers and provides access to visit summaries and results; NH Check In lets patients join virtual lineups; and NH Tracks gives families real-time updates during a patient’s surgical journey. Telehealth services also reduce the need for travel by enabling secure video appointments with health care providers and specialists from across BC. These tools support continuity of care and help patients stay connected to their health information from anywhere in the region.
